## SAMPLE SESSION — WEEK 1 · WEDNESDAY

# What a Real ARK Session Looks Like

Every session has an exact opening, exact prompts, and an exact closing. Nothing is left to chance.

## HOW TO OPEN THE SESSION

Sit down together with the device. Build a little anticipation — don't just open it cold. You say: *"I want to show you something remarkable. There's a helper that has read more books than any person ever could, and it can answer almost any question we ask it. Want to meet it?"*

## PROMPT 1 — TYPE THIS EXACTLY

### WEEK 1 · WEDNESDAY · FIRST PROMPT

*"Hi Claude! My child is [age] years old and wants to know what you are. Can you explain yourself in a fun and friendly way that a young child can understand?"*

Parent Note: Read the response aloud together. Pause after each idea and ask: 'What do you think about that?'

## FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS TO EXPLORE TOGETHER

After reading Claude's answer, try one or two of these. One good conversation beats rushing through a checklist.

- Do you think Claude actually understands us, or is it just really good at answering?
- What's the difference between Claude knowing something and us knowing something?
- What's the first thing YOU want to ask it?
- Do you think Claude is alive? What makes something alive?

## THEIR FIRST FREE CHOICE PROMPT

### WEEK 1 · WEDNESDAY · THEIR CHOICE

*"Tell me about [whatever your child chooses] in a way a [child's age]-year-old can understand. Make it interesting and fun."*

Parent Note: Fill in the brackets with their actual choice. Read the answer together and make a big deal of it.

## HOW TO CLOSE

*"You just talked to an AI for the first time. Tomorrow we're going to use it to explore some of the most amazing things in the natural world. What do you think the most incredible thing in nature is?"*

Leave them with a question. The best session ending is one that makes them think about tomorrow before they go to sleep tonight.

## THE PROMPT CARD SYSTEM

# Never Stare at a Blank Box Again.

Fill-in-the-bracket templates for every activity type. The more you use them, the more natural prompting becomes — until you're writing your own.

## STANDARD LESSON PROMPT

### EVERYDAY LEARNING · FILL IN THE BRACKETS

*"My [age]-year-old named [child's name] wants to learn about [topic]. Please explain it in a way that's fun and easy for a [age]-year-old to understand. Keep the response short — 3 to 5 sentences. End with a simple 'Let's Try It!' activity using household items."*

Parent Note: Replace every bracket before typing. The more specific you are, the better the response.

## CREATION DAY PROMPT — LEGO EDITION

### FRIDAY CREATION DAY · BUILD SOMETHING REAL

*"My [age]-year-old [son/daughter] named [child's name] has approximately [number] Lego pieces including [list a few special pieces if any]. They want to build a [what they want to build]. Give them a simple building plan with step-by-step instructions written for a [age]-year-old. Keep it short, fun, and encouraging."*

Parent Note: Get materials out before starting. Having them visible makes the design feel real.

## PRINTABLE PROJECT PROMPT

### PROJECTS & PRINTABLES · FORMAT-FIRST

*"Create a [printable black-and-white / printable color] [coloring book / activity sheet / story] for my [age]-year-old named [child's name] about [topic]. Format it so it can be saved as a PDF and printed on standard 8.5x11 paper."*

Parent Note: Always decide HOW you'll use the output before you prompt. Print vs. screen changes everything.

### ■ PRO PARENTING TIP

Not sure how to prompt? Just fill in the brackets in our ready-made prompt cards. The more you use them, the more natural it becomes — and soon you'll be creating your own!

### ■ PRO PARENTING TIP · FORMAT-FIRST RULE

Always decide HOW you'll use the output before you prompt. Will you read it on screen? Print it in black & white? Save it as a PDF? Include that in your prompt from the start — it saves time and gets better results.

## PARENT COACHING LAYER

# The 8 Golden Rules + Rescue Prompts

Built-in guidance so you always know what to do — even when the session goes sideways.

**1** Always let them pick the topic when they can

**2** Read every AI response aloud together

**3** Ask 'What do you think?' before reading Claude's answer

**4** Celebrate every completed creation — no matter how small

**5** Say 'I don't know, let's find out' freely and often

**6** Never correct their creative choices during creation time

**7** End every session with something to look forward to next time

**8** Progress over perfection — always, without exception

## RESCUE PROMPTS — FOR WHEN SESSIONS GO SIDEWAYS

<b>BORED?</b>	<i>"Tell me the most surprising, strange fact about [topic] that most people don't know."</i>
<b>STUCK?</b>	<i>"What should my [age]-year-old and I explore today? They like [area]. Give us 3 options."</i>
<b>TOO COMPLEX?</b>	<i>"Can you explain that again more simply for a [age]-year-old? Use a familiar comparison."</i>
<b>GREAT SESSION?</b>	<i>"What's the next level of interesting questions we could explore about [topic]? Give 3 directions."</i>
